TARGET AUDIENCE

Official veterinarians :

- from countries that have committed to the OIE PVS Pathway
- wishing to acquire additional skills and to progress in their functions and responsibilities

An advanced degree in the veterinary sciences and 3 to 5 years of relevant professional work experience are required.

TRAINING OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, the participants :

- will have the knowledge and skills necessary to actively participate in the design, implementation, evaluation, and coordination of veterinary public-health policies
- will understand how to implement OIE recommendations for their home countries

The content of the course will be adapted, on a case-by-case basis, to the local situation for each participant's home country and to the strategy designed for that country as a result of the PVS Gap Analysis (Evaluation of Performance of Veterinary Services).

PEDAGOGICAL METHODS

e-learning platform (PowerPoint with comments, interviews, videos, webinars...)

A personal project whose theme is defined by the participant and his/her administration: this will be discussed during the face-to-face session and followed up by a tutor.

CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Validation of training modules.

Validation of the personal project : written report and oral restitution.

SCIENTIFIC LEADERS OF THE PROGRAMME

This Diploma is under the scientific and pedagogical responsibility of an Orientation and Training Board composed by professors of the four French national veterinary universities, of the "Ecole Inter-Etats des Sciences et Médecine Vétérinaire" of Dakar, Senegal (EISMV) and of the "Centre National de Veille Zoosanitaire" of Tunis, Tunisia (CNVZ).

Experts on the OIE PVS pathway are also involved.
